Pete explains how Open Educational Practices in Scotland aims to enhance their capacity for developing publicly available and licenced online materials. This work is structured to





- Graduation is always a really special time of year and a chance to celebrate success and in the Scottish Graduation 560 graduates and honorary graduates were awarded their degrees in October.
- The OU welcomes Professor Peter Scott as new Commissioner for Fair Access. The role of the Commissioner is to be an advocate for disadvantaged learners, working across the education system to provide strategic leadership and drive change.
